English Instructor Responsibilities

- Teach English to classes of 8-15.
- Work with other camp staff members to plan and coordinate camp events.
- Prepare 15 hours of interactive lessons per week.
- Support and work with Action Camp Counselors to assist afternoon activities.
- Accompany classes on field-trips to surrounding towns.
- Monitor campers to ensure compliance with camp rules and prevent accidents.
- Participate in staff meetings.

English Instructor Requirements

- Experience teaching English as a second language, teaching degree, TEFL, or equivalent.
- Attendance to training days to understand Action Camp programming and get to know other staff.
- First aid, CPR, and additional training may be required or beneficial.
- Physical ability to participate in activities and support the weight of children.
- High level of responsibility and accountability.
- Upbeat, engaging personality.
- Strong communication, interpersonal, and leadership skills.
- Memorize all emergency procedures and enforcing camp rules.
